

 Percentage non-western immigrants is substantial and increasing










Ethnic concentration in the Netherlands

Functional Aspects Housing:

- Price
- Number of rooms
- Closed or open kitchen
- Sanitary facilities

Functional aspects Neighbourhood:

- Amenities (shops, parks, ..)
- security





Social aspects

Social Aspects Housing:

- Family life
- Friends, guests

Social aspects Neighbourhood:

- Neighbourhood as meeting place
- Social cohesion
- Community

(Influence/effect on functional aspects)



Expressive aspects

Expression of life-style

- Expressive aspects Housing
 - Social position (status)
 - Ethnic identity
 - Religious identity
- Expressive aspects Neighbourhood:
 - Design of public space



Significance

Research findings

- Living patterns non-western immigrants ≈ indigenous
- Non-western immigrants: average low socio-econ. position
- result: relatively poor housing situation
- Functional demands are dominant
- Expressive dimension is unimportant

(ibid. high educated immigrants)



Index of segregation, Rotterdam






Index of Isolation

Index of isolation (contact within ethnic groep), Rotterdam










Low-priced housing stock in The Hague (1998)








Illegal immigrants (Turks) in The Hague

Distribution of **legal** Turks in The Hague




Distribution of **illegal** Turks in The Hague


